Discussion	Letter regarding funding

CAEP (Community Aids and Equipment Program) a state based funding program (agreement between DSC and DOH) that will be eliminated when the NDIS (National disability insurance scheme) takes over. The NDIS will be rolled out across WA from the $1_{\rm st}$ July 2017 until the $30_{\rm th}$ June 2020. See attached document for summary of roll out dates.

CAEP have changed their funding allowance for \$300 for lower limb (the ceiling price for upper limb garments and trunk compression garments remain unchanged at \$900).

Please note that if a patient needs a garment that exceeds the ceiling price then the item needs to be approved by the CAEP committee/ DSC representatives. This involves the therapist submitting a letter explaining the client's clinical need for the item and rationale as to why the specified item is deemed 'basic and essential' to meet the clients needs. Generally with valid rational, approval is gained to order an item over the ceiling price.

The LAA and the ALA are working closely together to resolve the issue of funding for garments and are also collaborating with BCNA , cancer collorabative ect...

Catherine Hunt is representing WA people by working with the ALA and the LAA and she has requested some guidance as to how to proceed with lobbing for more appropriate funding.

Conclusion	Catherine has been asked to draft a letter stating that: The current funding is not realistic or appropriate for lymphoedema. Lower limb garments are by nature more expensive because they are larger, need a higher compression and generally bilateral. Please note that if I client is needing bilateral garments you can consider this 2 garments and hence the ceiling price is double (ie\$600) which is still insufficient but worth noting.
